Speaker: The Other Literacies by Dr. Joe Engemann

Introduction of Speaker by Susan Drake

Summary of Presentation: The Other Litera- cember 12, 2013. cies

In his talk, Joe made a passionate case for expanding the focus of instruction in schools to include the "other literacies". While he acknowledged that all literacies are important, some of the essential literacies such as History, Geography and Science (as well as the Arts) are being neglected in favour of time spent on basic literacy and numeracy instruction. In part, this situation may be the result of the accountability that

teachers feel for standardized testing that occurs in Ontario at grades 3, 6, and 9 for literacy and numeracy and the grade 10 literacy test which must be passed in order to graduate from high school. As a former Science specialist, he specifically focused on the importance of Science in schools pointing out that Science provides the tools necessary for making informed decisions about health, for understanding the environment and for deciding which scientific topics are worthy of funding. Furthermore, Science enables us to understand ourselves and our capacity to improve the human condition. Students need to develop a habit of open-mindedness and the ability to see possibilities in Big Ideas (i.e. Atomic Theory).

The talk provoked discussion by raising questions about the need for subject specialists above grade 6, whether funding for research in literacy and numeracy is limiting funding and materials available in schools related to the other literacies, and whether teacher accountability related to literacy and numeracy is undermining attention to the outcomes in other subject areas. He suggested that Awareness, Advocacy and Accountability should be applied equally to all subject areas.
