terms as one of the first persons he got to
know when he came to St Catharines in
1958. Roger commended Dr Peter McMain
not only for his multi-level success as a paediatrician, but also as a true philosopher and
independent thinker. Peter has been an

How Natural Dyes Colour History by Dr. Peter McMain

Most dyes are historic, beginning in Egypt around 2945 BCE. Hence Peter took the club on a journey that included a visit to a Turkish rug factory, Newton's theory of light, Goethe's use of pigeon excrement and wine, the bison cave painting at Altamira, neolithic charcoal (black dyes are very scarce in nature and generally do not dissolve in water), Aboriginal ochre, the Elgin marbles, lapis lazuli from Afghanistan and the Pope, Nero's exclusive use of purple, the Indigo Wars and Mahatma Gandhi, the colour orange and the New York state flag, green wallpaper and Napoleon's suspicious death, and Queen Victoria's mauve with the coming of synthetic dyes.
