My Merchant Navy Life by Roger Brook: Roger began on a somber note: At least one hundred million perished during World War II. The world's population at the time was only two billion. He then led our club in a minute of silence in keeping with the date (November 11) and his topic.

Roger enlisted in the merchant marine at age 16 and served from Feb. 1941 to July 1947, rising to the position of second mate. Happily, Roger experienced little combat although many in the merchant marine did. He visited ports around the world: Liverpool, Cape Town, Melbourne, New York and Singapore, from Greenland to New Zealand. Along the way he learned Pidjin, saw Mae West's last performance, encountered the very heavy waves of the Mediterranean, and attended a weekend party on Long Island. Roger was most grateful for the legacy of Alfred Holt and his company of merchant ships, the Blue Funnel Line. A good report from Holt made it made it possible for him to enrol in medical school—fully paid for.
